FINAL REMINDER: REGISTER FOR BOSTON ORIENTATION

The Boston Orientation [registration](#) deadline of Monday, June 1, is quickly approaching (this deadline excludes newly enrolled Transfer students). Available dates are posted in students' [Application Status Check](#).

Failure to register may affect your student enrollment status. If your fall plans to attend Northeastern have changed, or if you need [admissions assistance](#) to further discuss your enrollment, please let us know, otherwise, [register now](#) for a session.

Boston Orientation is mandatory for all First-Year, Transfer, and Veteran students.

- First-year students must attend a two-day program, with a required on-campus overnight stay.
- Transfer and Veteran students must attend a one-day program that takes place prior to the start of fall classes.

Boston Orientation is optional for those transitioning from a Northeastern program.

- New York City Scholars, London Scholars, and Oakland students, along with those completing the NU Immerse and Foundation Year programs are invited to take part in an optional half-day program that takes place prior to the start of fall classes.
